GENERAL RULES AND INFORMATION

Teachers, participants and parents are responsible to familiarize themselves with the syllabus and rules before registering. Failure to comply with the general rules will result in disgualification. In case of disgualification, fees will not be refunded.

1. ELIGIBILITY

- Competitors must be bona fide residents of the Southern Interior of British Columbia.
- All classes, unless otherwise specified, are open to amateurs only. The term "amateur"
 means one whose principal income is not derived from the discipline being entered. This
 condition does not apply to conductors of choirs or choral groups, nor to those bona fide
 students of music, who teach for the purpose of applying the money so earned to the
 furtherance of their musical education.

2. ENTRY INFORMATION

- Be sure to provide complete information. Include your instrument name where applicable, the categories, and class names, titles of selections, composer, and accurate performance times for each selection.
- A participant can enter the festival as either competitive or non-competitive. This
 designation is identified by clicking on it, in the on-line registration form. Participants who
 choose to enter non-competitively will receive comments from the adjudicator for their
 performance, but will not receive a mark, or be eligible for awards. They are scheduled
 separately from the competitive classes.
- Entries (with the exception of Non-Competitive, Ensembles, and certain designated Vocal categories) must be taken from the current or one previous Royal Conservatory or Conservatory Canada syllabus.
- Participants are responsible for entering the correct classes. The festival cannot be responsible for detecting errors.
- Pieces must be played as entered; no changes will be accepted. A selection in the wrong category will receive adjudication only. No mark will be given.

- Levels of all entries are determined from either the Royal Conservatory of Music or Conservatory Canada current or one previous syllabus. If a piece has changed levels or is listed differently in different syllabi, the *current RCM syllabus* determines the level. Pieces entered at the incorrect level or not from the above syllabi, will be disqualified.
- Students must enter at the level in which they are currently studying.
- The level must be consistent in all classes entered except where specified, such as in concert class, where one piece can be one level higher, or ensembles which are entered at the level of the most advanced player.
- Age of the competitor is determined as of December 31st before the upcoming festival.
- Adults aged 23 and above may enter competitively or non-competitively, but are not eligible for scholarships and awards.

3. COPYRIGHT REGULATIONS

- Only original scores or copies authorized by copyright owners may be used at Festival venues.
- The performer must provide the adjudicator with an original score or authorized copy of the selection to be performed
- Accompanists, Directors, Groups, and Soloists must use original copies in performance venues.
- Use of unauthorized copies will result in disqualification. If a student is found to be using a photocopy, they will receive an adjudication only with no mark and the piece will not qualify for scholarships.
- Authorized copies must be accompanied by a letter of authorization from the copyright holder which must be given to the secretary at the time of performance.
- If a selection is in the public domain, a letter confirming this fact is required from the publisher along with permission to copy.
- The use of internet downloaded music is permissible if it states on each sheet "Public Domain" OR there is a receipt of purchase attached to each piece downloaded, verifying the purchase. If membership in a site provides free use of the material downloaded, proof of membership MUST be provided. Music downloaded from the free website imslp.org is permitted. Please write the full URL of the work being performed on the first page of all parts and copies being used
- The Vernon Performing Arts Festival allows photocopies for the purposes of page turns, but the full score MUST still be present at the performance venue, in addition to an original copy for the adjudicator.
- Vocal scores may be transposed to suit voice ranges if copied "by hand" the original score must be present.

4. PERFORMANCE SCHEDULING

- Number of entries and level will determine class divisions
- The festival cannot accommodate a participant's or teacher's requests for preferential scheduling
- Festival classes may be scheduled for any day of the week

- The Festival Committee reserves the right to eliminate, combine, sub-divide or create classes as deemed necessary or to refuse any entry
- Except for non-competitive classes, participants may only enter once in any class, but are encouraged to enter several classes.

5. ADJUDICATION

- Teachers, participants, parents of participants, or members of the audience should have no unauthorized communication with the Adjudicator prior to or during the festival.
- Unauthorized communication with an Adjudicator by the participant or their parents or teacher will result in disqualification of the participant..
- The Adjudicator shall have discretionary power to stop any performance at any time.
- In all matters of adjudication, the Adjudicator's decision shall be final.
- No protest or complaint may be addressed directly to any adjudicator.

6. VENUES

- Unless a special room is provided, NO part of the venue may be used for practice during the festival.
- Family and friends of the performer and the performer must remain in the areas designated for festival participation.
- Absolutely no food or drinks are allowed into any venue
- Talking and entering/exiting the venue are not permitted during a performance
- All mobile devices should be silenced in the performance space.

7. PERFORMANCE PROCEDURES

- Erase all marks and notations on books
- Number the first measure of each line on the music provided for the adjudicator.
- Arrive at the venue at least 15 minutes before scheduled performance time.
- When your name is called, hand your book to the Adjudicator's Secretary before proceeding to the performance floor or stage.
- Performances must be from memory to qualify for scholarships and awards, with the
 exception of ensembles and the Strings Sonata class. If music is used, marks will be
 deducted accordingly.

8. ACCOMPANIMENT

- Strings and Vocal performances must be accompanied by piano, with the exception of unaccompanied solos and self-accompanied vocal classes.
- Participants are responsible for arranging their own accompanist.
- Pre-recorded accompaniment tracks are not permitted

9. SCHOLARSHIPS

 Categories of scholarships and awards are determined on an annual basis, based on entries.

- To be eligible for any individual scholarships, a student must enter at least 2 competitive classes, excluding ensembles, and, with the exception of the Strings Sonata classes, must perform from memory.
- Ensembles do not need to perform from memory to be eligible for awards.
- Determination of scholarships is based on a student's top 2 marks of 85 and above, excluding ensembles, and at the discretion of the adjudicator.

PROCEDURE FOR ONLINE REGISTRATION

- Please double check the accuracy and spelling of your entry, as what you type in is what will be printed. No changes or substitutions may be made after registration or at the time of performance.
- It is the responsibility of competitors and teachers to follow the Rules & Regulations of the Festival. Entries are the responsibility of competitors and teachers. Errors or omissions are not the responsibility of the festival.

CHORAL

- The competition is based on two or three contrasting selections, one of which may include a brief solo or solo ensemble passages. The total bars for a solo or solo ensemble passage may not exceed 10% of the total score.
- One selection may be one or more movements of a multi movement work.
- Only one folk song is permitted.

Total Time: 30 minutes for warm up, performance and adjudication
Choirs are responsible for their own accompaniment. Recorded accompaniments are permitted.
Choirs must stay for the duration of their class. Directors, please ensure students
observe proper concert etiquette.

School Choirs:

The members of the school choir must all be from the same school. Split grade classes are entered in the higher grade category.

- Grade 4 & under
 - o unison
- Grade 6 & under
 - one selection sung in two parts is strongly recommended
- Grade 8 & under
 - o at least one selection sung in two or more parts
- Grade 10 & under
 - o at least one selection sung in three or more parts
- Grade 12 & under
 - o at least one selection sung in three or more parts

Community Choirs:

Ages are determined as of December 31, preceding the festival

- 12 and under
 - at least one selection sung in two parts is encouraged but not necessary
- 16 and under
 - at least one selection sung in two or more parts
- 19 and under
 - at least one selection sung in three or more parts
- 19 and over (the majority of the members must be 19 or over)
 - o at least one selection sung in three or more parts
- Seniors Community Choir
 - Two or three contrasting selections
- Mixed Community Choir (no age restriction)
 - Two or three contrasting selections
